Jump for the Cause and Perris Valley Skydiving Center Hosted Wounded Warriors

Jump For The Cause (jumpforthecause.com) , a Women's World Record Skydiving Event, celebrated our nation's wounded warriors on Wednesday, September 23rd, at Perris Valley Skydiving Center (skydiveperris.com), Perris Valley, CA. The two organizations hosted a dozen Wounded Warriors (woundedwarriorregiment.org) for a day of fun, sun and skydiving.

The Wounded Warrior Regiment's mission is to provide and facilitate assistance to wounded/ill Marines, Sailors attached to or in support of Marine units, and their family members throughout the phases of recovery.

The service members all went for a tandem skydive and enjoyed the spectacular Jump for the Cause Women's World Record Skydiving Event. At sunset, ex-Special Forces and Golden Knight, Dana Bowman, jumped into the event under a Purple Heart canopy while flying smoke and a 1000 square foot flag.

The Women of Jump for the Cause gave the service men a standing ovation during Dana Boman's speech that night, and later that week the women set a new Women's World Record (181) and raised over \$900,000 to fight breast cancer!

"The best part for me", began event organizer Mallory Lewis (Lamb Chop's Sister) "was the opportunity to thank these brave young men for all they have done for our country, and to show take a moment to show the record girls that as spectacular as their achievement is, there are servicemen and women out there ready to make the ultimate sacrifice of life and limb, to protect us and all our nation stands for. It was an amazing honor to have the Wounded Warriors with us!"
